






# Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.



Martin was born in 1929 and died in 1968.  
He lived to be thirty-nine years old.  
He was born in Atlanta, Georgia.  
He was a peaceful man who wanted equal rights  
for Blacks in the United States.

## NOTES TO ADULTS




Martin Luther King, Jr., is remembered today because he was a man who believed that people should live together in peace. He worked all of his life to achieve this.




Together the Kings worked to improve the lives of Negroes. Martin always sought to use peaceful means to settle arguments between individuals. Coretta supported him and raised their four children.






Martin loved to go to church with his family and listen to his father talk to the people about God. The sound of his father's voice was exciting to Martin. Martin wished that he could be like his father.


