Directions: Tell the child that you are going to read a story and then ask him or her some questions about it. Read the story aloud. Then read each question. Have the child answer each question orally. After each question is the expected response. The child's wording of the response to each question may vary from the stated answer. Use your own judgment in deciding whether the child's response is correct or incorrect.

Scoring: Give one point for each correct answer. Record the total number of correct answers on the Evaluation Chart. (Total possible points: 5)

3. Where was Mrs. Mole going to take the things she baked?

4. How did Mrs. Pig like what Mrs. Mole baked?
She thought it was awful, or she did not like it.
5. What mistake did Mrs. Mole make?
She baked lemons instead of apples.
