Parents Need Care, Too







Sometimes Family Members Have Special Needs




Sometimes a family member needs special help. Draw a line to match each person with a child who can help.




Families Take Trips



Sometimes a family takes a trip together. Help this family find the way to the campsite. Draw a line to show the way through the maze.





Sitters Take Care of You




Sometimes parents go out. A sitter takes care of you until they come back. Follow the path from each sitter. Find out which one is coming to the house.




Note to Parent: Talk with your child about the kinds of sitters that he or she knows. With whom does your child feel most comfortable?
