Read Aloud

Abby's Ice Cream

When the man handed Matt his ice cream cone, he said, "You know, I have ice cream that has no sugar. It's just for dogs."

"Wow!" Matt said, and he bought Abby a small ice cream. "An ice cream truck that sells ice cream for kids and for dogs!"
