

ANTIQUÉ PICTURES

MATERIAL: Scraps of white pine wood or some soft wood, ballpeen hammer, sandpaper, brownstain, black paint, coffee, picture, Elmer's glue, clear varnish.

DIRECTIONS: Soak the picture in coffee, when it is wet, tear to size desired. Let soak until it picks up coffee tint. Then let dry.

Now bang the wood with the hammer to make dents, except where the picture will go.

Next sand the wood.

Then put on stain with a brush. Wipe off with a rag.

Now put on the black paint and wipe off with a rag.

Then dry glue picture on with Elmer's glue.

Finish by spraying the whole thing with CLEAR varnish.
