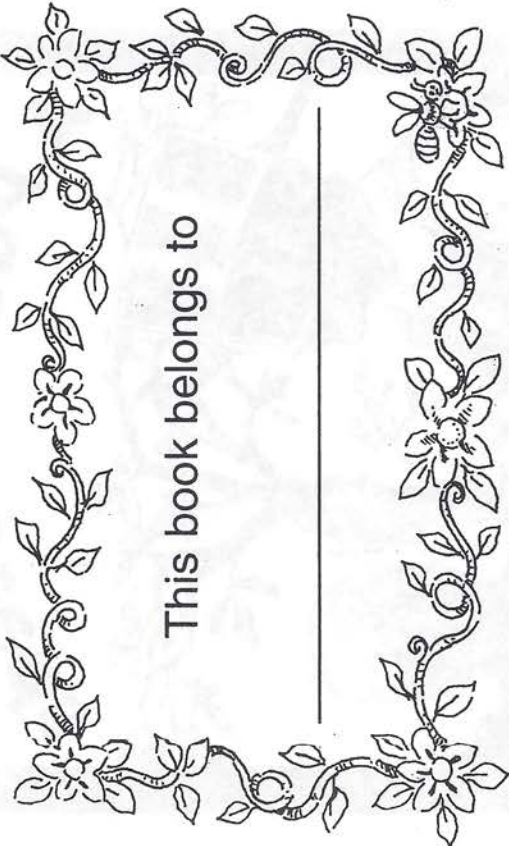

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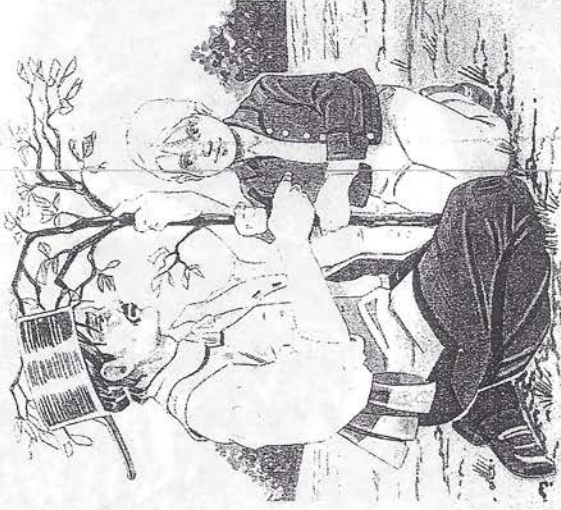

**High-Frequency Words:** ask, kind, over, any



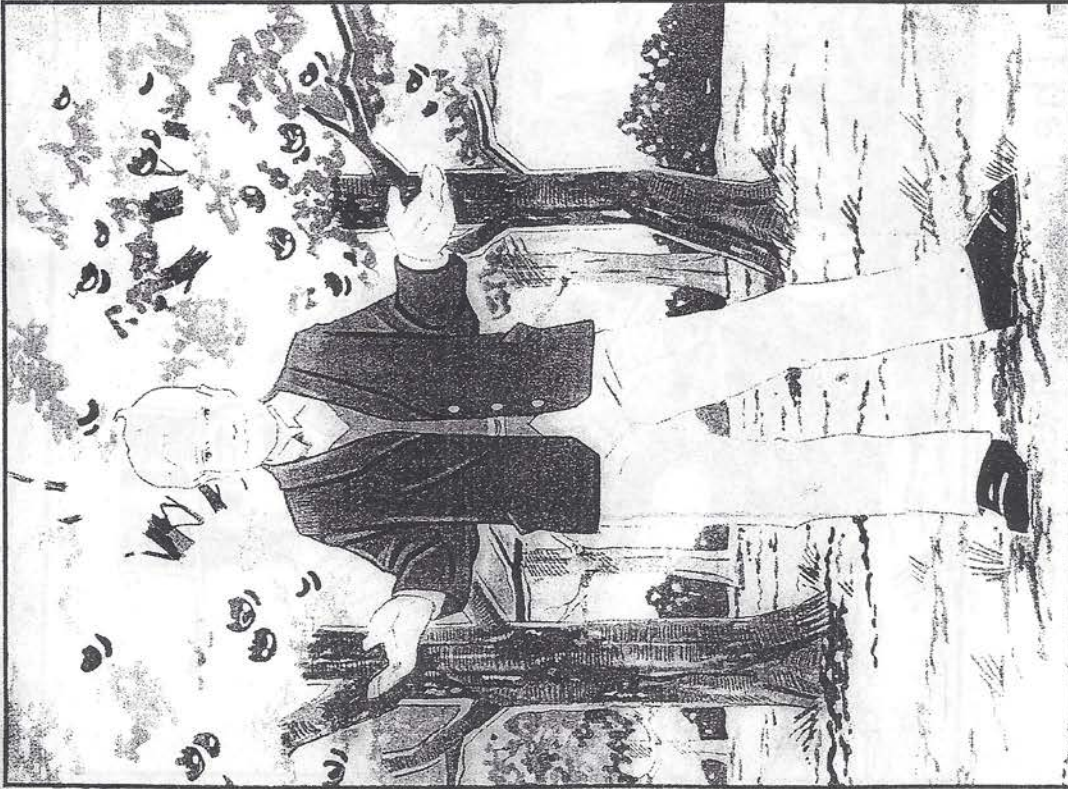
# A Pack of Seeds



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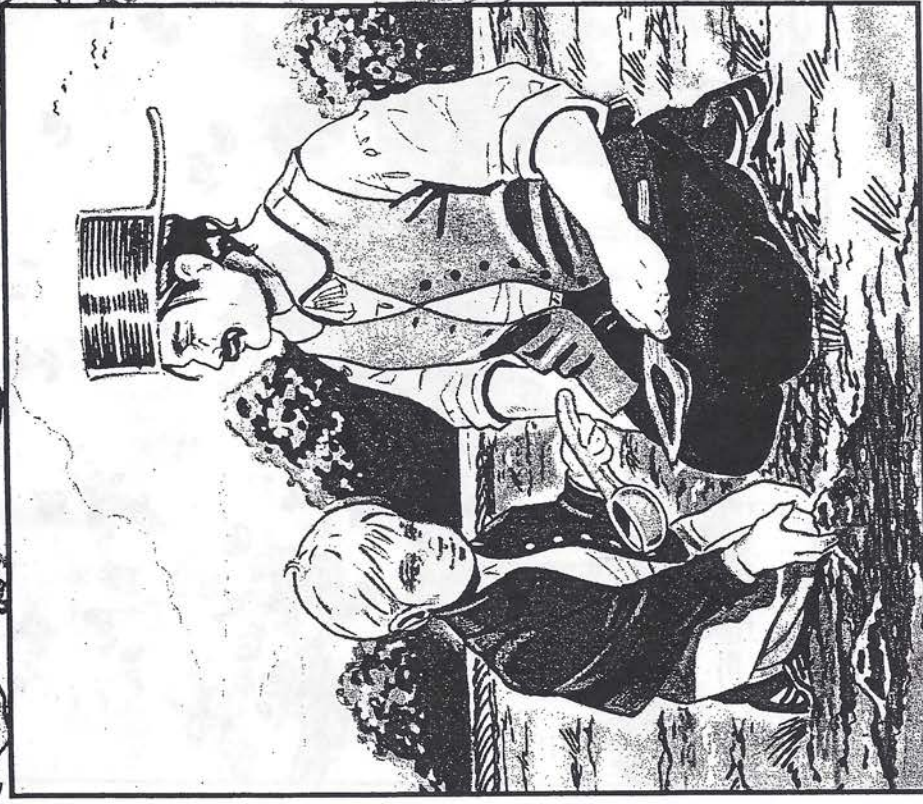


Now I have lots of apples!  
There are apples everywhere!



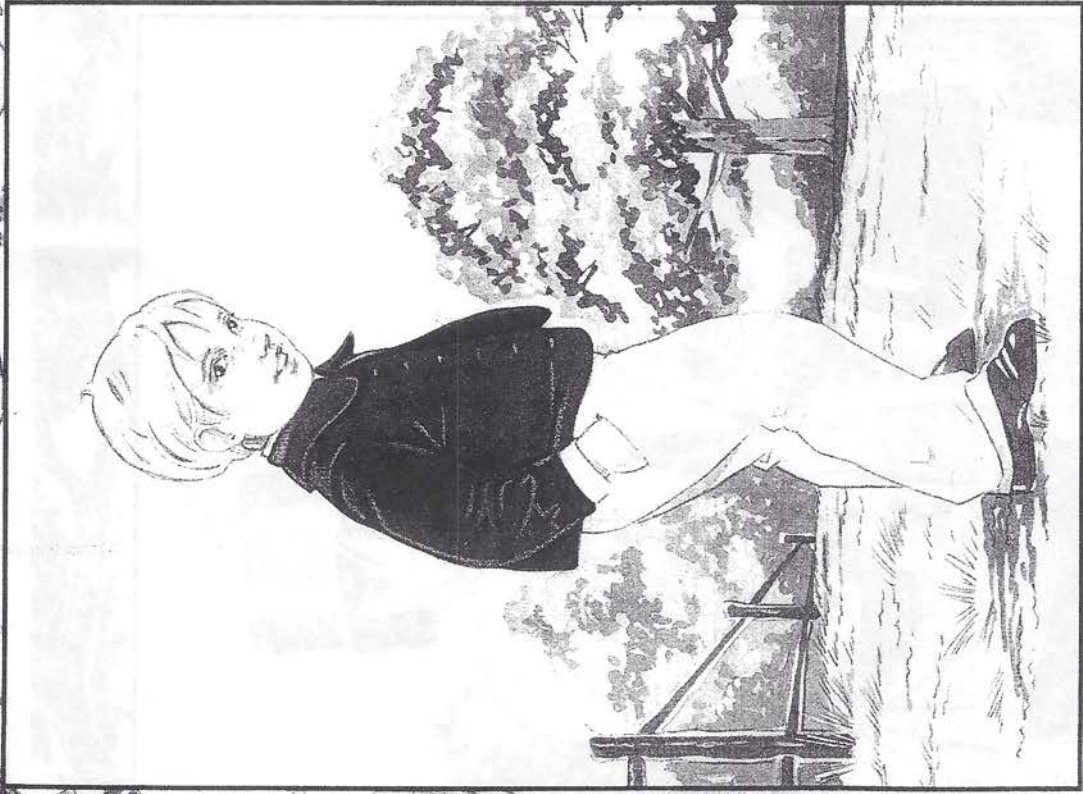


I saw a man.

The man looked funny.

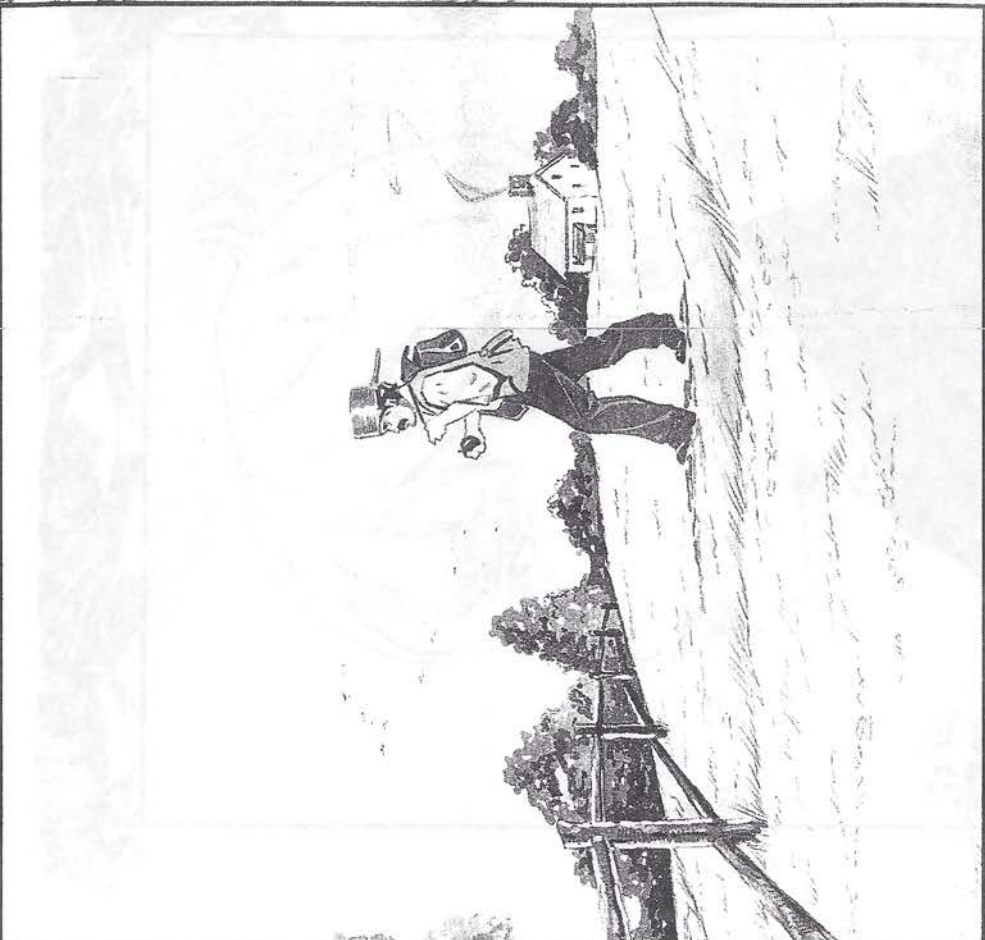


The man helped me.

They need water too.



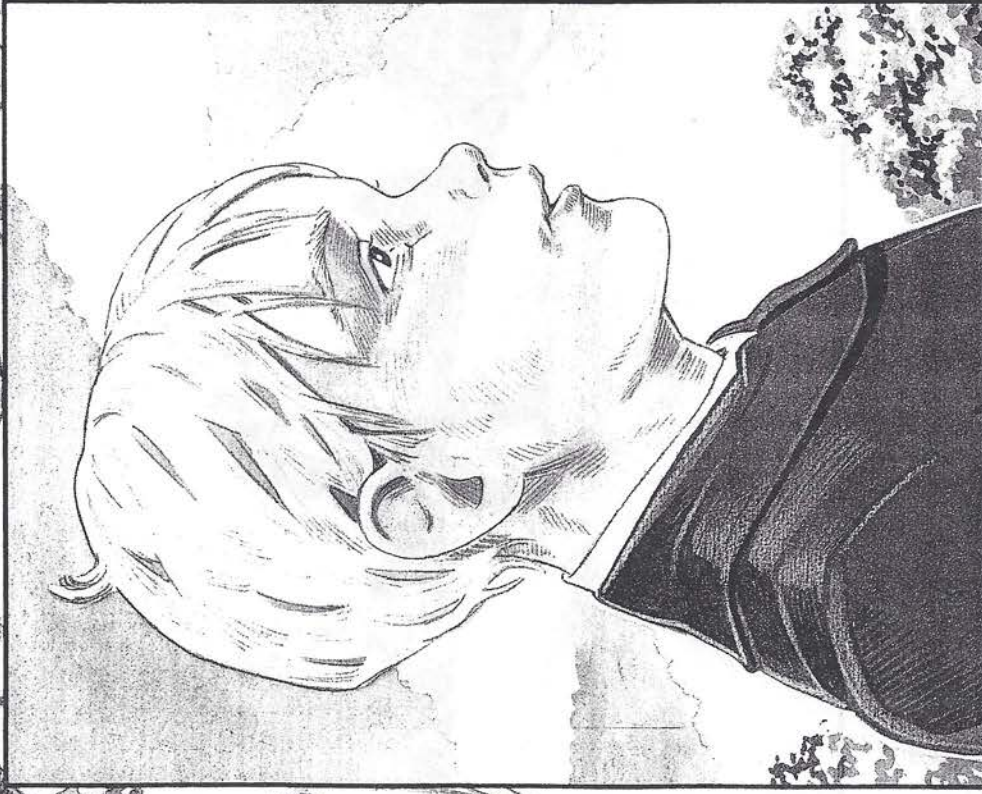


I wanted to keep the seeds.

The man gave me some seeds.

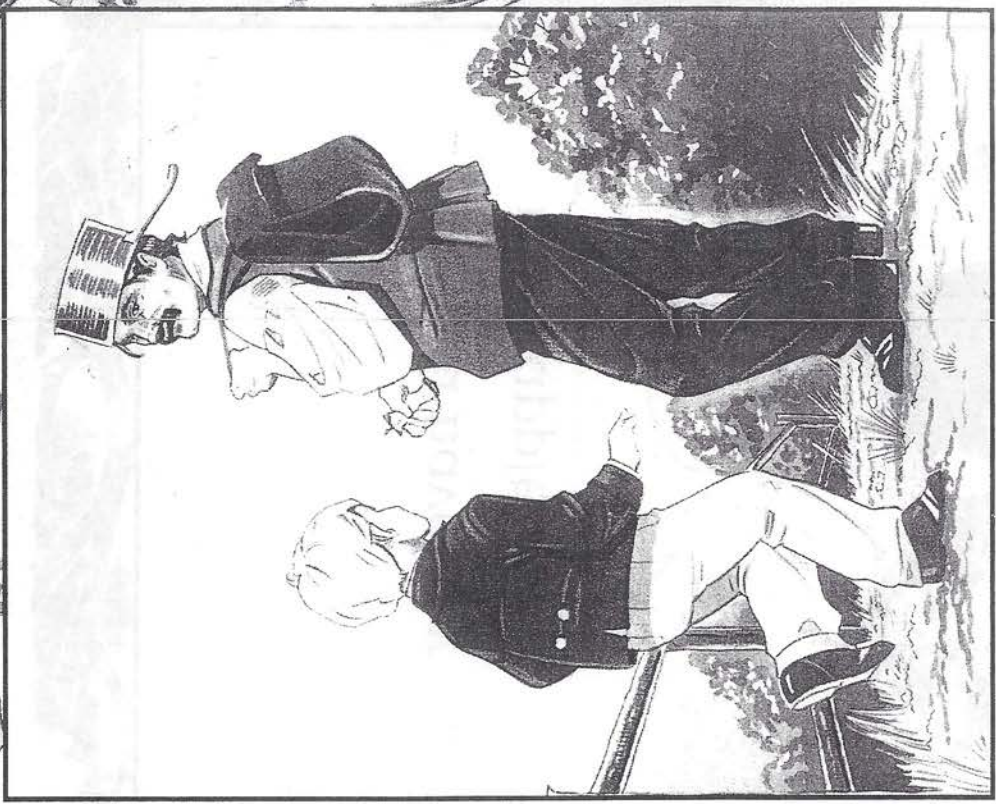
He was very kind.
