Little Miss Muffet

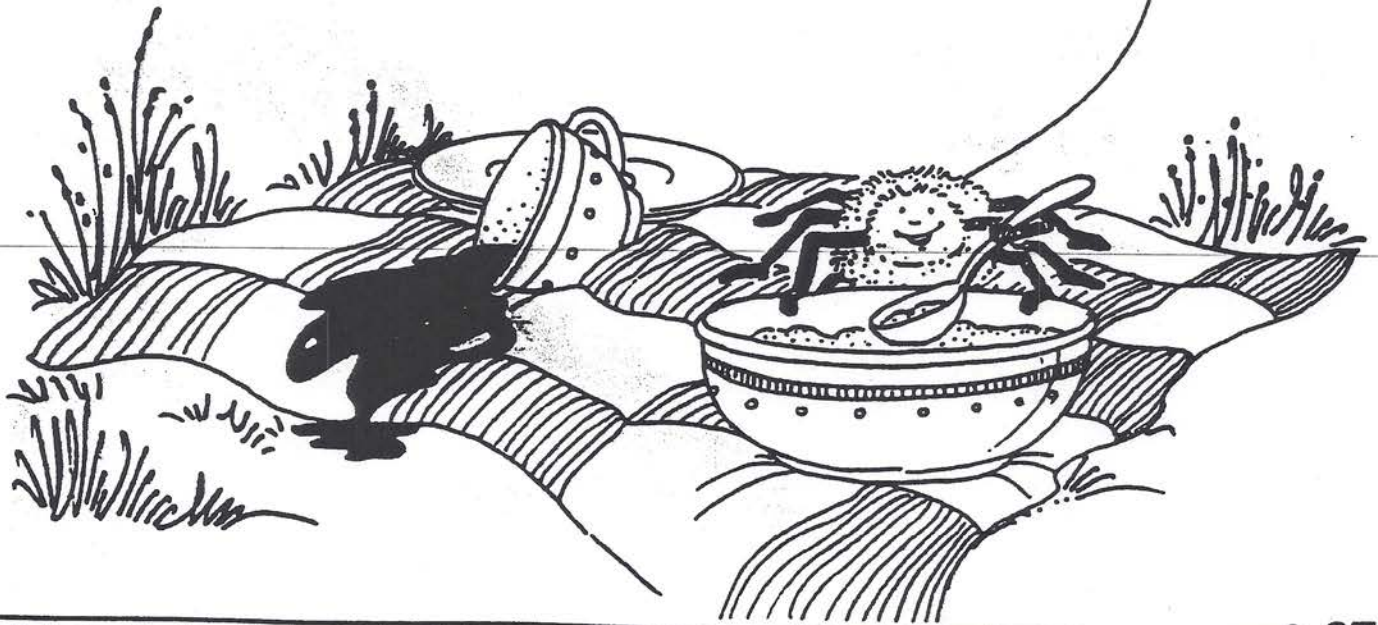
Sat on a tuffet,

Jack fell down

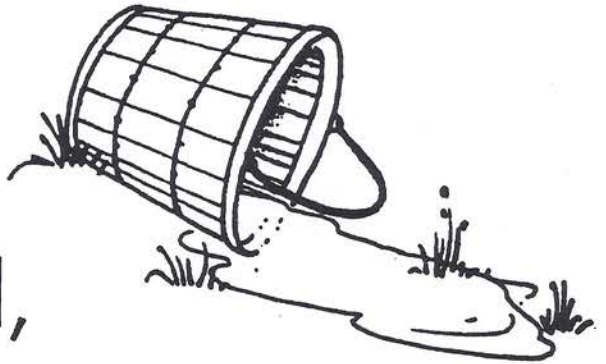
And broke his crown,

so high,

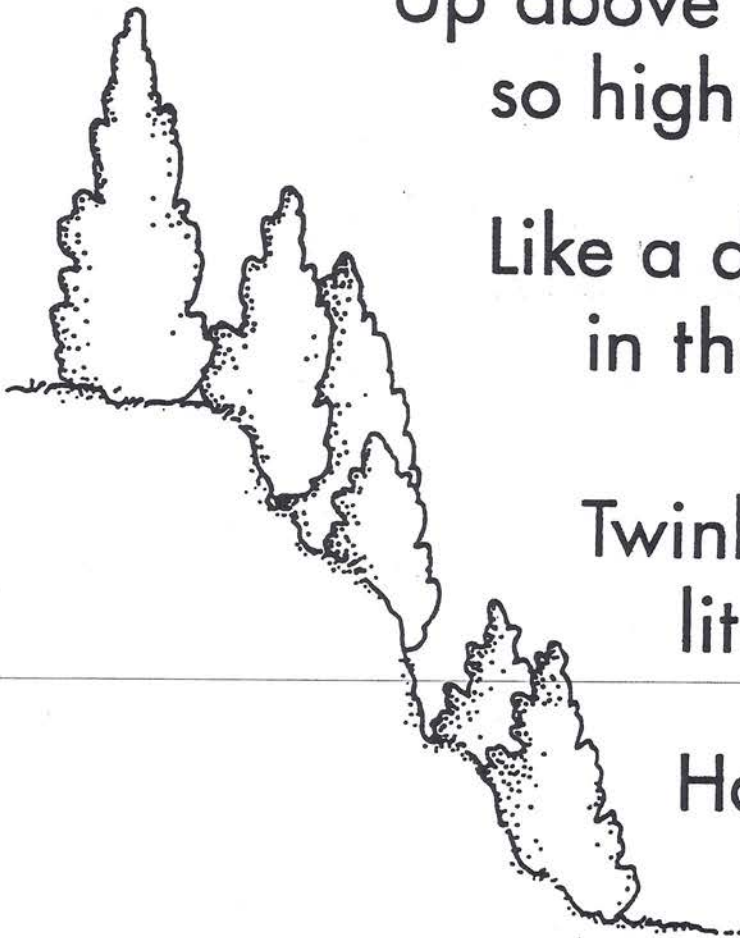


Like a diamond
in the sky.

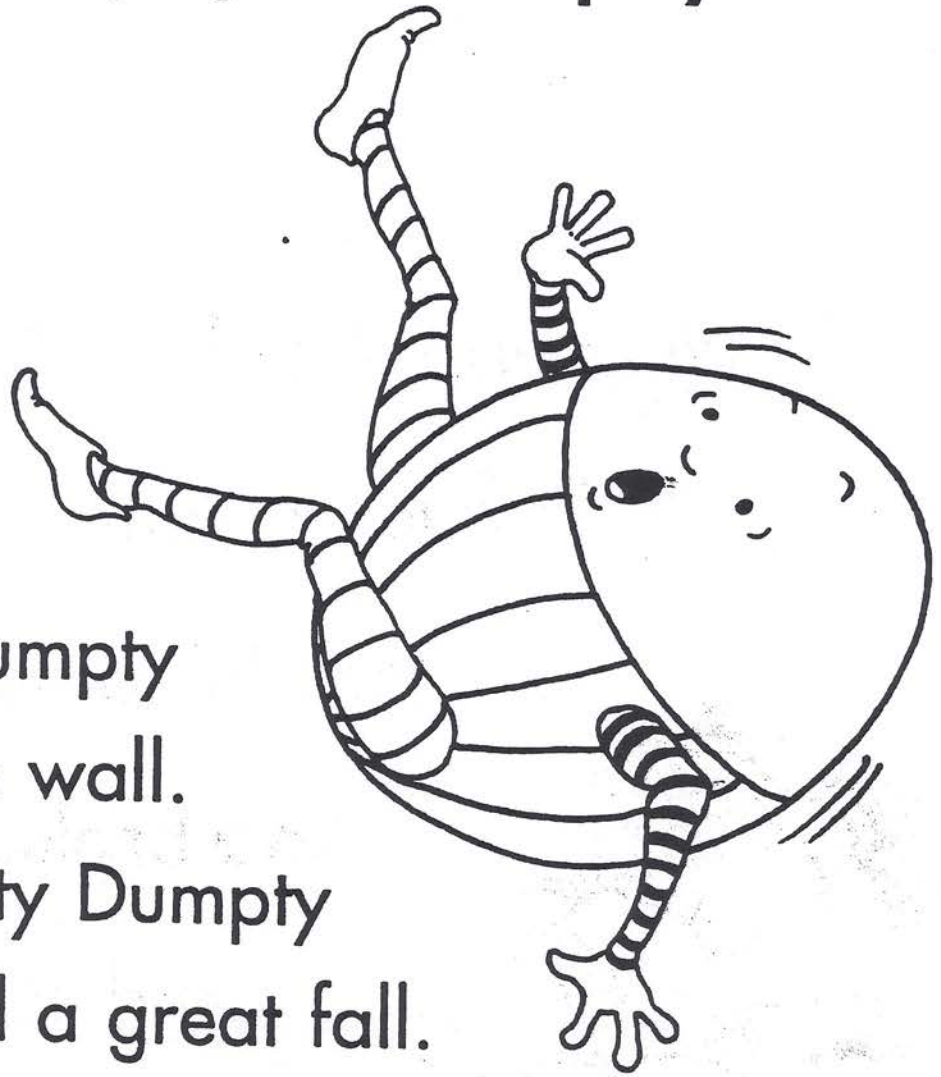

And all the king's men

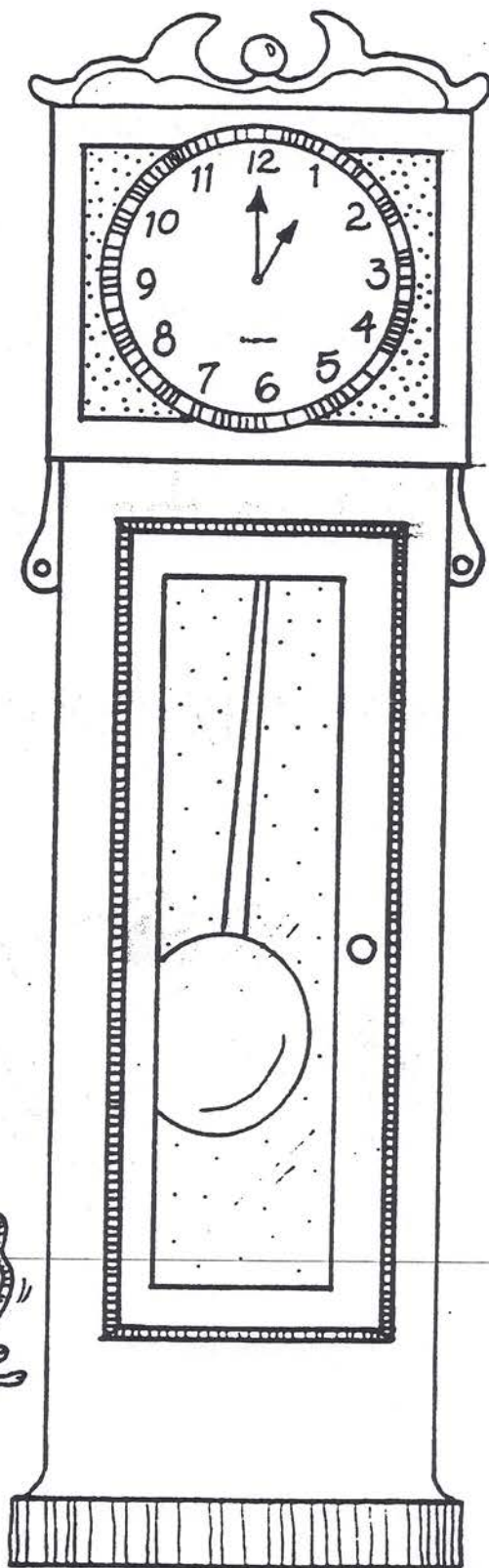
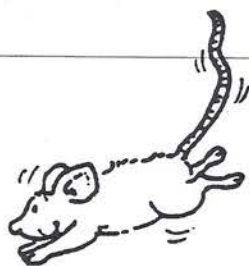

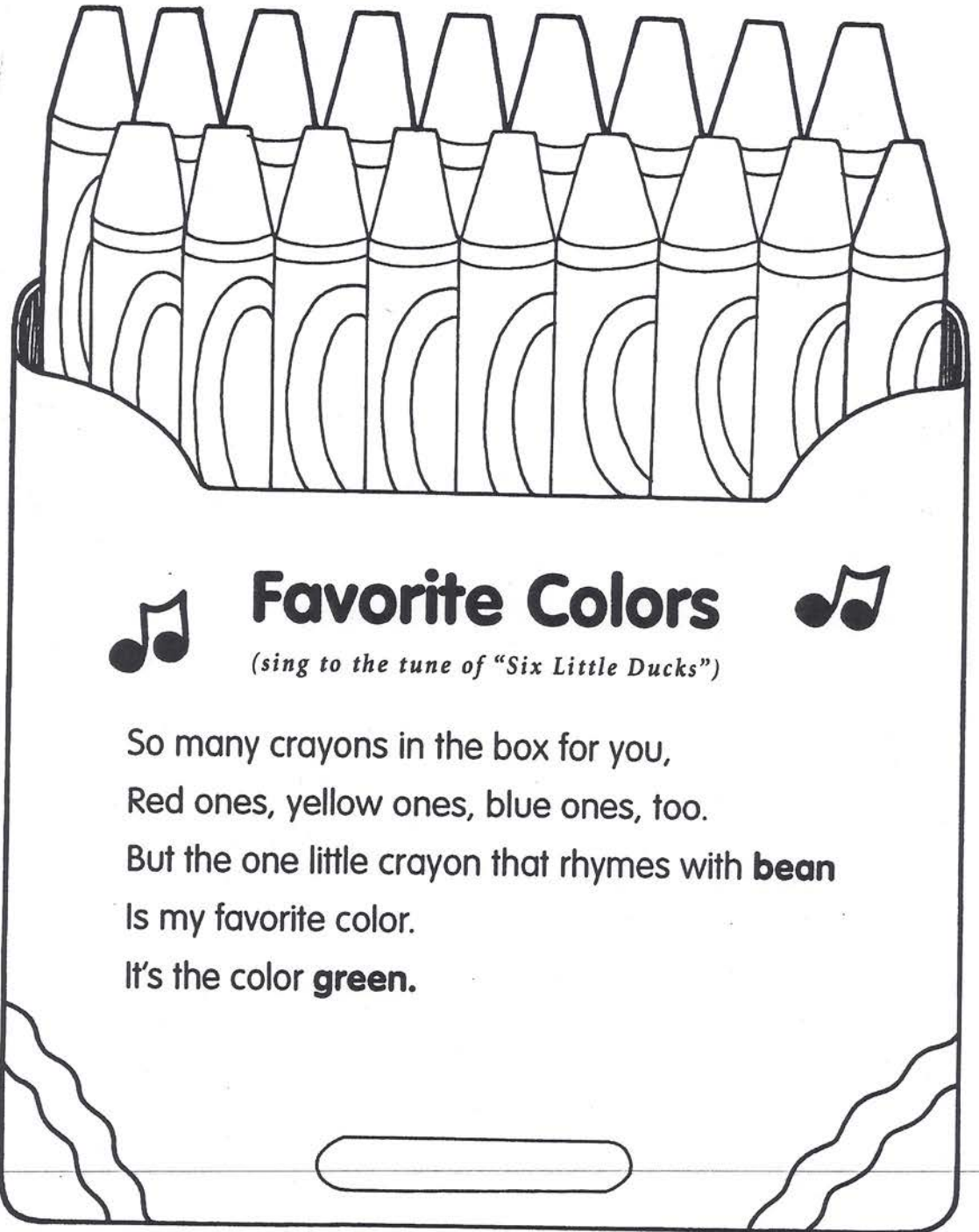
