

Project #25: Bouquet in a jar, courtesy of Mrs. F. J. (Judy) Tatulli,
Cub Scout Pack 91, Willingboro, N. J.

Materials:

squat baby food jar and lid
artificial flowers (plastic)
silver sprinkles
gold braid
glue

Cost:

Nominal (take individual flowers off a 29-cent spray; silver sprinkles are a few cents a tube in the 5-and-10 and 2 yards of gold braid will decorate 8 jars)

Instructions:

- A. Remove the label and wash the baby food jar.
- B. Fill the jar with water and add silver sprinkles and the flower. (To make more realistic you can plant the flower in waterproof green modeling clay on the lid of the jar.)
- C. Screw the lid on tightly and decorate its rim by gluing gold braid around the edge. The lid becomes the bottom of the "snow scene".

Note: Remember those old snow-scene paper weights? I've never seen any modern ones where the snow drifts down as delicately. You might try adding a little glycerine to the water to make the silver sprinkles settle more slowly. Mrs. Tatulli's Den have made these as Mother's Day gifts for the past three years. They look nice on a window sill.
