them. Use markers to add a face.





## No Cat can catch this mouse!



- 1. Use a 1-inch pompom for the mouse. Glue on wiggle eyes, two 1/4-inch pompom ears, a tiny pompom nose, and a yarn tail.
- **2.** Glue a magnet to the bottom of the mouse.

- 1. Glue a 1-inch pompom to a 11/2-inch pompom.
- 2. Cut ears and a tail from felt.
- 3. Glue four pompom legs, the felt tail and ears, wiggle eyes, pompom cheeks, and a pompom nose to the cat.
- 4. Glue two magnets together. Figure out which side of the magnets attracts the mouse magnet. Glue that side to the bottom of the cat. Slide the cat on a flat surface toward the mouse, and watch the mouse move away!
